





The dual apprenticeship system in Germany: an interview with IAB Director Joachim Möller

<u>Youth unemployment</u> in Germany is very low by international standards. In an interview to the IAB-Forum magazine, IAB Director <u>Joachim Möller</u> attributes this success to three factors: the favourable economic situation, the introduction of "youth employment advisory services" (*Jugendberufsagenturen*) supporting the transition from school to employment and, in particular, the well-established system of <u>dual vocational training</u>, which combines on-the-job training in the firms with part-time education in a vocational school. Möller also discusses the question, to what extent this system is transferable to other countries.

This video is the fourth interview of a series of interviews with Joachim Möller that address selected aspects of the labour market in Germany (the <u>German job miracle</u>; the <u>German minimum wage</u>; <u>refugees and migration</u>; the dual apprenticeship system; active labour market policy; and the digital revolution).
